



WHERE and how to communicate & disseminate?

- Coordinate a series of scientific publications which are suitable for advancing the knowledge and discussion of the relevance of PPL policy design for sustainable societies
- Cooperate with stakeholders and policymakers
- Coordinate the provision of timely information on research findings for these groups in an easily accessible form, such as short videos, policy briefs and white papers
- Initiate sessions and roundtables at international conferences to enrich the discussion on PPL policy design and its consequences and relevance for social sustainability
- Organise workshops and training schools for students and early career investigators (ECIs) from countries with less capacity in the field of PPL research
- Organise a conference with stakeholders and policymakers at the end of the Action
- Ensure online access to all the meetings, workshops, and the conferences for those who are unable to join physically at the time of the event
